Selectronix Statement on Conflict Materials

Dear Valued Customer:

The United States Congress passed legislation in July of 2010 requiring corporations to report the use of "Conflict Minerals" in the manufacture of their products. The current law, generally referred to as the "Conflict Minerals Law", was included as Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, passed by the US Senate on May 20, 2010 and signed by President Barack Obama on July 21, 2010.

"Conflict Minerals" in this context refers to specific minerals originating from mines controlled by armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or adjoining countries. The specific metals in question are: Gold, Tantalum, Niobium, Tin, Iron, Manganese, and Tungsten.

Selectronix does not source any materials directly from any smelters who may procure these materials from the DRC or other . We have received statements from suppliers who ensure they are not sourcing raw materials from these restricted countries. Selectronix is committed to complying with any applicable requirements under the Conflict Minerals Rule. In addition to not directly sourcing materials from these countries, we continue to do our due diligence with our supply base to meet our obligations under the legislation.
